*Craig Gundersen is an Associate Professor in the Department of Agricultural and Consumer Economics at the University of Illinois. He is also a Research Affiliate at the National Poverty Center at the University of Michigan. Before coming to the University of Illinois, Gundersen worked at the Economic Research Service (ERS) of the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and at Iowa State University. Gundersen received his PhD in Economics from the University of California, Riverside in 1996.*

*Gundersen's research expertise spans several areas related to food insecurity and food assistance program participation, including program evaluation, determinants of poverty, measurement of food assistance participation and food insecurity, and, most recently, the relationship among stress, food insecurity, and childhood obesity. His work has been published in highly ranked peer-reviewed journals including, but not limited to: the Am J Agricultural Economics, J Nutrition, Am J Public Health, J Human Resources, Demography, and Southern Economic Journal. He has also published multiple government Extension reports. His research has been primarily funded by the USDA, the Meals on Wheels Association of America Foundation, Inc., and the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID).*
